Students who participate in the research internship will gain a deeper understanding of research methodology through hands-on experience with original research. Interns will be supervised by a faculty member in the School of Criminology and Criminal Justice.

Intern Qualifications/Eligibility

- Admission to the Upper Division of Criminology & Criminal Justice Program
- 75 hours completed
- 3.0 cumulative GPA / 3.25 GPA in the Major*
- 250-word essay (see details below)
- Permission from Research Internship Coordinator

Internship Course Requirements

- 156 hours of work during the semester (log sheets signed by direct supervisor)
- Meet with Research Internship Coordinator at least twice during the semester (orientation meeting, end of semester debriefing)
- Complete IRB CITI Training
- Journal about internship experience (minimum of once per week)
- Final integrative essay (10-15 pages, double spaced, using 12-point fonts and one-inch margins. The essay should also include a reference page that adopts APA citation style.)
